To help meet our purpose and goals, to broaden our service opportunities, and for the overall success of THRILL, PVSA's will be awarded to those that have planned and implemented a service project for THRILL as well as documented qualifying service hours.

Service Projects: We will again offer favorite service projects such as Mission Lexington, Hope Bridge for the Hollies Fall Festival, Operation Christmas Child, and more. **We ask all THRILL students, along with the help of their parent(s),to plan and organize one community service project for the upcoming school year. Working together, parents and THRILL leaders can teach students project planning and leadership skills. The THRILL coordinators are available to assist in the planning.**
